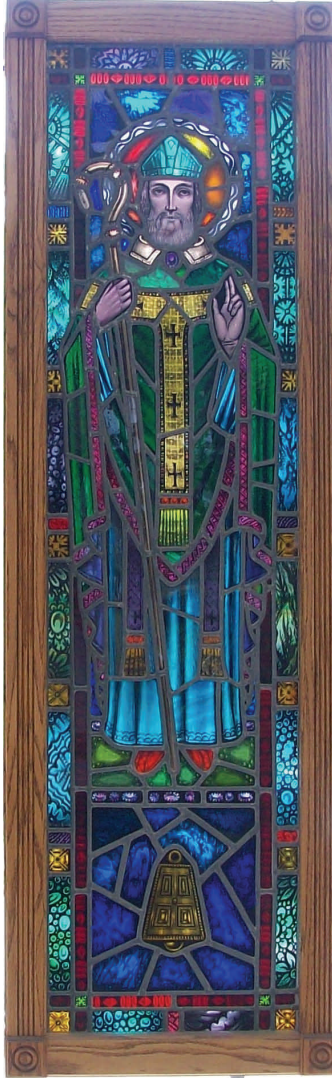

BUILDING UPDATE

WE'VE GOT A NAME!

The verdict is in. The Parish Council has met with Fr. Mike and the building across the street now has a name! *St. Patrick Catholic Community Building* will be the official title of our facility located at 1601 N. Bishop. This will be more than a building to us, it will be a place where we meet together to build the Kingdom of God here in our little corner of His world. Please join me in continued prayer for the success of this endeavor. We have made progress (as was shown in the flyer in the bulletin not too long ago) and have the floor repairs in place. More news to come in the days ahead.

WE'VE GOT LIGHTS!

When we signed on as the owners of the building (now known as St. Patrick Catholic Community Building) in October 2009, we also signed on for the responsibility of the upkeep and operation of the building. Although the expenses of the renovation and furnishing of the building are part of the building fund campaign the day to day expenses are not. We have lights, water and phones in the building as well as property insurance that has become part of the operating budget of the parish. We need to pay for those utilities through the operating budget just as we pay for those same utilities for the hall, the Newman Center, the School, the Rectory, the Church and the Parish Office.

When we took on this facility we had thought that through but we have now come to understand that we had not relayed this information to the parish at large. Please accept our sincere apology for any misunderstanding that may have taken place. While building funds will pay for renovation and furnishing the building, utilities will be an expense of the parish operating budget. If you have any questions please call the parish office.

When a loved one is dealing with a serious illness, it is not only alarming to them, but also to those who love them. Your parish family wants to be able to be with you in your time of need. The prayer chain can be engaged by calling Helen Parker at 364-1190. Another important call is to the parish office, especially if one is hospitalized. We have parishioners, i.e. Third Order Franciscans and others, as well as the deacons and pastor who want to be part of the healing process. As Catholics, we focus on a holistic approach to healing, i.e. wonderful professional medical care, loving family and friends, and the faith family working together.

As your pastor, I want to be as present as I can be. We have our own community hospital and I am part of our care-giving team. When folks are at hospitals [for more than five days, or emergencies] outside of the community, I want to know, so when possible, I can visit. I cannot promise to always be able to respond, but if I am unaware of the hospital stay, I have no opportunity to visit.

What is crucial is that we as a faith family want to try to be present in times of need.

If someone is truly homebound (unable to go out to eat, shop, etc.) and certainly if Hospice is involved, we again want to be present to share the love of Christ in the midst of the challenges folks are going through.

STEWARDSHIP QUOTE OF THE WEEK

The Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"For where your treasure is, there also will be your heart" (Luke 12:32-48). The trash we put on the curb to be discarded reveals much about who we are and what we do in life. It contains the packaging of the products that we treasure. It reveals where our hearts are. What is in our trash? Is it packaging from the latest electronic games, the best type of athletic equipment, the current fashion in clothes (no matter how revealing), the appliances with the most features, containers that held gourmet foods, too many empty liquor bottles and beer cans, and the shredded documents of the fortune we are trying to amass? There are some people whose hearts are not revealed by their trash. They have no trash. Sadly, they have nothing to throw away. They do not have sufficient food and they have very little clothing. We would do well to remember these words of Jesus, "Much will be required of the person who has much, and still more of the person entrusted with more." When we bring our trash to the curb we should ask, "How much treasure have I been entrusted with? What does this trash reveal about my heart?"
