St. Patrick Church Purchases New Sacred Vessels

Sacred vessels are the receptacles and utensils used in liturgical celebrations to hold the consecrated Body and Blood of Christ. These are the chalices, patens, and ciborium. The sacred vessels are to be treated with special care and reverence.

Precious metal is the preferred and best material to use for these items. The artistic style and design of the vessels may reflect the local region; however they should be designed in a way to make it apparent that they are indeed sacred vessels for liturgical purposes, not something for everyday use.

After several years of discussions, including recent consultations with Parish Council, Finance Council and Liturgy Commission, I am pleased to announce that St. Patrick Parish has purchased new sacred vessels for use at our celebrations of the Eucharist -- the source and summit of our life in Faith in Christ. This will be an entire matching set for use in both the church and the chapel and includes 4 chalices, a daily paten, 3 distribution "bowl patens," one large "bowl paten" for presentation of the bread at offertory, and one Ciborium. Because they are terms that we use regularly, but don't always know specific definitions of, they are defined below:

CHALICE: The word chalice comes from the Latin word 'calix', meaning cup. The chalice is also called a sacred vessel and is held in special honor [GIRM#327] by the worshipping community as it is the cup that holds the Blood of Christ when the wine is consecrated at Mass. All chalices used at a Eucharistic Celebration are to be made of precious metals as a sign of the importance of these sacred vessels.

PATEN: Patens or plates are used to hold the hosts for communion. Like the chalice, the paten is to be made of precious metals and it is also called a sacred vessel as it will hold the Body of Christ once the words of consecration are said by the priest at Mass.

CIBORIUM: Similar to a chalice but covered and larger, used for reserving the Body of Christ in the Tabernacle for prayer of adoration in Church and to take communion to the sick. It is made of various precious metals, and the interior is commonly gold or gold-plated.

As they are set aside for use in Eucharist, there is a special blessing ceremony that is done (during Mass) before the first use. I am working closely with the Liturgy Commission to choose a date and plan that ritual, which we hope to announce soon! Several individuals and some groups of the parish have chosen to make special donations to help defray the cost of this one time purchase. This individual donation is not expected of anyone and is not necessary for us to "afford them," but it is certainly a noble way to come together, taking pride and ownership in our parish. Anyone who would like to make a monetary donation is welcome to do so in any amount at any time. Simply mark your check or envelope as "Sacred Vessels."
