Who decides who will bring up the gifts at Mass?

The Church's official instruction does not mention "how gift bearers are selected" but rather simply, "It is a praiseworthy practice for the bread and wine to be presented by the faithful." Currently the ushers try to note who the Mass intention is for and, inasmuch as possible, chose relatives/acquaintances of that person.

After consulting with the Liturgy committee, beginning the weekend of February 24th, 25, the process will change: People will be able to volunteer as they arrive at Mass.

Here is the simple way it will work:

A small crucifix will be on the gifts table near the bread and wine. When you enter church for Mass, if you would like to volunteer to bring up the gifts, simply take the small crucifix to your pew with you. After the intercessions (Petitions/Prayers of the Faithful), simply come to the back of church, return the crucifix to the table and, after the collection (if there was one), bring the gifts forward.


The new process should give more people an opportunity to bring up the gifts. In the event that no one picks up the crucifix before Mass starts, the ushers may still invite people to do so, or if necessary, bring the gifts up themselves. Normally there are 3 "things" to carry, however, it could be 2 or more people in the procession (either members of a family or a group of parishioners).
